

Are You Ready For February 17, 2009?



If you use “rabbit ears” or a rooftop antenna with an analog television, you must take some action before February 17, 2009 to continue receiving television broadcasts. Full-power television stations nationwide must switch from the analog method of transmitting TV signals to only broadcasting a digital signal. The information below will help you identify what you need to do to be ready for the digital switch on February 17, 2009.

All of your TV sets are connected to cable, satellite or other pay service

If all your TV sets are connected to cable, satellite or other pay service, check with your provider to see how they will support your analog set after February 17, 2009.

At least one TV set in your home is not hooked up to cable, satellite or other pay service

You must take action before February 17, 2009. Your options include:

- Buy a converter box that will plug into your analog TV.
- Buy a TV with a digital tuner.
- Connect your analog TV to cable, satellite or other pay service.

A converter box is a one-time purchase that will allow you to use your analog TV after February 17, 2009. The Federal Government is offering U.S. households up to two \$40 coupons to help pay for the cost of certified TV converter boxes. Certified TV converter boxes are expected to cost between \$50 and \$70.
